Free School Meals and the Pupil Premium

The 'Free School Meals / Pupil Premium Service' www.fsm.lgfl.net is a web site where parents can quickly and easily check eligibility for free school meals and, if eligible, also gain welcome additional funding for their child's school, known as 'Pupil Premium'. If eligible, you are not obliged to accept the free school meals for your child if you wish to make other arrangements, but we do want to encourage applications as the additional funding gained would still benefit education provision at the school.

What the service does for parents:

After entering essential details into the web site, the online application process links to the Department for Education system for checking eligibility and gives an immediate 'yes' or 'no' response, and will notify the school.

This system is being provided to encourage parents to apply and take advantage of free school meals while at the same time increasing the benefit to schools from Pupil Premium funding, a substantial amount of which does not reach schools because not all parents who are eligible apply for free meals for their child.

By way of a 'thank you' to parents for taking part, and regardless of individual outcomes, <u>The London Grid for Learning (LGfL) would like to provide parents with</u> <u>Sophos Anti-Virus software, free of charge, to protect the computers used by</u> <u>pupils at home.</u> (To gain access to this software there is a short registration process)

What the service does for schools:

As the government has now introduced free school meals for all children in Key Stage 1, it is more important than ever for schools to know the number of pupils for whom they can claim Pupil Premium funding. These funds enable schools to take on additional staff and invest in additional equipment, resources and activities to the benefit all children.

THE GREAT EGG RACE 2017

As you know we are going to hold a great egg race on 30th March. Eggs will be carried on a mobile that your children design and build themselves. The mobile can be of any shape or size and we are encouraging children to be as creative as possible.

The egg-mobile needs to be able to roll/move, either battery powered or with the help of the force of gravity. Please see below the rules that have to be followed.

Rules of the Great Egg Race

- 1. The egg-mobile must carry a chicken's egg.
- 2. The egg must be hard boiled.
- 3. The egg-mobile is to be designed and built out of school.
- 4. As far as possible, the egg-mobile must be made without help from grown ups.
- 5. You may work on your own, in a pair, group or family, but the egg-mobile may only be entered for one class race.
- 6. Each egg-mobile will have an independent run on the course.
- 7. No mains electricity may be used to power or move your egg mobile.
- 8. Batteries are allowed.
- 9. No living creature may be used as an egg-mobile.
- 10. If the egg-mobile uses its own source of power, it will be released from a slope. If it uses another source of power e.g. air, battery, it will start from a flat surface.
- 11. Once your egg mobile leaves the start, you may not push it, pull it, control it or re-start it.
- 12. Please do not use any glass in your design.

13. Each class has their own race. There are 3 winning categories for each class :

The most beautifully decorated The most original design The greatest distance travelled

14. The judges' decision is final.

If you need advice about your egg-mobile or a piece of equipment that you don't have at home, please ask a teacher.
