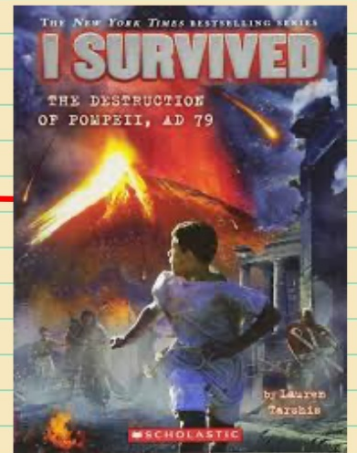

Another common homophone is your and you're
