<i>Word</i>	<i>Meaning</i>	<i>Example Sentence</i>
<b>identity</b>	Your identity is what makes you you.	The spy wanted to keep her identity secret.
<b>immediate(ly)</b>	This minute, right now, straight away!	When my phone rang, I answered it immediately.
<b>individual</b>	A single person or thing that cannot be divided.	Every individual person is unique.
<b>interfere</b>	To get involved in order to stop something happening.	A teacher will interfere if children are not behaving properly.
<b>interrupt</b>	To stop a conversation or disturb the peace and quiet.	No one must interrupt the children taking their SATs.
<b>language</b>	Words and grammar that we use to communicate with in words and writing.	Most people in our school can speak more than one language.
<b>leisure</b>	Time off or spare time to relax.	The children spent their leisure time playing cricket.
<b>lightning</b>	Flashes of electrical light in the sky.	The thunder came four seconds after the lightning.
<b>marvellous</b>	Incredibly good or great.	George made some marvellous medicine for his grandmother.
<b>mischievous</b>	Naughty or annoyingly playful.	Our mischievous dog chewed dad's shoe!
