<i>Word</i>	<i>Meaning</i>	<i>Example Sentence</i>
muscle	a noun for part of the body and a verb to show strength or power	The heart is a strong muscle. The strong warrior muscled past the weaker soldiers.
necessary	something you need to survive	It was necessary for Anya to take her medicine every day.
neighbour	someone who lives close to you	Our neighbour invited us all to a Halloween party.
nuisance	something or someone annoying	The fly was a nuisance because it kept sitting on my food.
occupy/occupied	to live or stay in a certain place	They have occupied their flat for three years.
occur	when a thought or event happens	A full moon occurs every 28 days.
opportunity	a chance to do something	Every child at Downsell has the opportunity to be a Play Leader.
parliament	the people who govern a country	The leader of the British Parliament today is the Prime minister, Boris Johnson.
persuade	to try and make someone think an idea is good	My friend persuaded me to drink more water every day to be healthy.
physical	when something is physical it is really there in the body (not in the mind)	PE means physical education or learning how to keep your body healthy and fit.
